

You have registered to take the July 7-19, 2019 advanced session for 4 credits from the University of Maine Machias through their Early College program. Here is more information about the course:

- The cost of the credits for the summer of 2019 is \$531.80. This is over and above the AIO tuition listed on the registration form but you will pay it when you pay the tuition. You will also need to return the Early College Application and Release Form that are in your registration packet. **These forms are due no later than May 1, 2019 and must be sent to AIO rather than college.**

- This opportunity is being offered to 23 rising juniors and seniors in the July 7-19 advanced session. Spaces will not be held verbally so you must return your summer program application or register online to secure a spot

- Beside participation in the existing AIO program, you will be expected to attend some additional labs, lectures and be given an end-of-session lab practical and final exam. You will receive the syllabus during an orientation on the first day of the session.

- This is a graded course and the credits can be transferred to any college that accepts outside credits.

- Students have until July 9 at noon to drop the course for credit without penalty from UMM and with a full refund of the cost of the credits. The \$100 registration fee paid to AIO as part of the tuition is non-refundable and you will continue with the regular AIO Advanced Session. After that time, you accept all financial obligations to UMM for the course and all grades will become a matter of record. No new registrations will be accepted after July 9 at noon.
